The Wednesday Bible Class at Zwelitsha

We have seen interesting growth in terms of attendance. I understand that most of denominational people who are coming to this class are coming for the purpose of disputing and openly opposing what we are teaching. I'm really glad that they are doing so because I know that the seed of the kingdom of God is planted in their hearts every time they come here. One of them, a 22-year-old young man who had claimed that it was prophesied by his minister that he possessed great healing powers when he was sixteen, submitted to the gospel of Christ. I took him then and there to the waters of baptism. He left those who came with him really disappointed and ashamed.

At the moment we are studying the Periods of the Bible History by Bob and Sandra Waldron. I don't have the actual study guide but I'm using the notes I took while I was in Port Elizabeth a couple of years ago.

The Men's Bible Class on Fridays

I'm a bit disappointed to see that only a very few men here attend this class regularly. However, I'm glad to see that the class is really helping the men who attend not just to develop an ability to teach and present lessons in an appropriate way but also to conduct themselves in a respectable manner. Most of them seem to realize that Christians must at all times conduct themselves in a respectable manner, especially those that who would like to teach the word of God.

Fridays With the Young Men

These six young men were all baptized last year and requested then that I pay special attention to them as they were constantly mocked both at school and in the township as backward boys. I pick them up every Friday after school and spend time with them until the time comes for me to pick up other men for the Friday class with all the men. I think this class has helped me to understand them better. Most of them say that this has helped them to escape Friday's peer- pressure challenges.

Brother Ayabonga and Zwezwe are two of these who are very smart and they both desire to be evangelists when they are fully mature in Christ. They both preside over the Lord's table and lead singing. Nothing pleases me more than to see the young men show so much dedication, as well as an absolute and admirable humility toward the word of God.

The Church at Seymour

Brother Zola was involved in a car accident. He was involved in a head-on accident with a bus and he is still in the hospital. Please remember him in your prayers.

I spent the last week of January at Seymour . I really enjoyed the time there and we did studies and a house-tohouse together with the brethren there. They were really encouraged. I urged them to remain strong even though their number has decreased every year because of some problems which are beyond their control. I visited them again the second week of February.

The Church at Zwelitsha

Another young man was baptized here after the service last Sunday. Painfully though, two young men have been instructed by their father never to come to "that" church again.

Sister Ntombekhaya and her husband and another sister have moved to Dimbaza (about an hour drive from here). I have been encouraging them to meet there on Sunday mornings. It is really hard and expensive for me to pick them up every Sunday morning, and there are many people there who show a great interest in the gospel.

We are planning to have a special series of classes there soon. The brethren have suggested that we invite brother Joel Williams and Robin Bauer.

Other Bible classes

Recently, I participated in discussions on one of local radio stations here. It looks like it will continue every Sunday evening. I'm praying that it does.

I have a number of other really interesting classes which are not as formal and regular as those that I always mention but I think these classes are as interesting as every Bible class I have.

Please pray for our family, as my wife has returned to do more police training and I am always concerned for her safety. It is challenging for me and for my son, Emilhe, when she is gone.

The Wednesday Bible Class at Zwelitsha

My sister in the Lord, sister Vicki Copeland, having read from one of my reports that we are studying from the works of Bob and Sandra Waldron and that we were only depending on some notes I happened to take from the classes I participated in while I was at Port Elizabeth a couple of years ago, saw fit to get me the whole set of books. We are so grateful to the Copeland's and we've already started utilizing their wonderful gift.

The brethren are all encouragingly attending this class. We are very pleased with the dedication they show in all the activities that the church here organizes.

The Men's Bible Class on Fridays

All four of the elderly men we had here are no longer able to attend both the Bible classes and the Sunday services and we've decided to have only one Bible class on Fridays. We created the second class to accommodate the young men who were lacking the basic understanding of the Bible to help them get the basics. Now that they are getting along with their Bibles we have decided to have only one men's Bible class on Fridays. I'm pleased to see that they always bring along other young men to these classes, mostly their friends from school.

The Church at Seymour

Another young woman died at Seymour. She was one of those who obeyed the gospel when we started the work at Seymour but a year after she was baptized she got married to a non-christian and two years later she became very sick. We will bury her on Saturday the 17th.

The brethren there are doing very well; the young men there are growing both physically and spiritually. I still visit them two times a month.

The Church at Zwelitsha/Sweetwater

We have a serious problem with Amanda, who seems to be jealous of the progress of the young women who have been baptized much more recently than she was. At first she tried to block them from coming to church and attending Bible classes, but they refused. Then she tried to get them to attend Jehovah Witness Bible classes but they invited us to attend also, so we went there and refuted the lies taught in those classes. Now she and some of those who erred with her are physically attacking some of the young women who are refusing to listen to her. My wife has advised them to report her to the police. We tried to speak to her on numerous occasions but she denies attacking them.

Last month the church here was blessed by a visit from brother Joel Williams. He spent three days with us and taught several Bible classes on different subjects. We were all extremely encouraged by his visit and when he left we all wished that he could spend more days with us. May Our God keep on blessing him with the wisdom that he graciously shared with the brethren here.

Other Bible classes

A 34 year old paralyzed man who studies with me from his house was baptized last week. He can't move beyond his house but he is very intelligent. We have planned to take some brethren to have Sunday afternoon services at his house and he is very pleased with that arrangement.

The Church at Zwelitsha

The church here is doing very well. We continue to grow both in numbers and spiritually. All those who left the church with Amanda have come back and she has also come back but the brethren are very skeptical of her motives.

We were blessed by a visit from Brother Joel Williams. He came on Friday the 21st and left on the 24th. As always, he did a great job teaching us about zeal in the Lord. The brethren have urged us to invite him again soon so that he can be here for longer than a weekend.

There is an encouraging increase in both the attendance and participation in the Wednesday class. The brethren seem to be really dedicated to advancing their Bible understanding through this class. They have suggested that each time we come to the Wednesday class we need to do some door knocking here in the neighborhood. I think this is a great idea that shows that brethren want to be involved in evangelism here.

There are now twelve young men attending the Friday class full time, seven of whom are members of the church. There are good signs that even more will be coming to join this class.

On Friday, November 28th, all these young men will head to Seymour with me where we will spend the weekend studying a book by Robert Turner: Plain Talk about God's Church. All of them will be done with their final examinations this week. We will be joined by nine young men who are at Seymour. This is going to be costly, but it's worth the expense.
